





Complete the following steps to replace the area light bar in a Express 250 charging station.

1. Using a T25 Security screwdriver, loosen the two captive screws on the area light bar.




2. Disconnect the power cable that connects the area light bar to the LED display assembly. Remove the area light bar.



NOTE: When reinstalling, ensure the gasket on each end of the area light bar is properly seated around the plastic tab.



3. Ensure the gasket on each end of the new area light bar is properly seated around the plastic tab.





4. Connect the power cable from the LED display to the new area light bar.

5. Position the new area light bar above the LED display with the lights facing downward. Align the area light bar and hold it in place with enough force to compress the gaskets.




6. Use a T25 Torx security driver to tighten the two captive screws on the bottom edge of the area light bar.



2. Disconnect the power cable that connects the area light bar to the LED display assembly. Remove the area light bar.



NOTE: When reinstalling, ensure the gasket on each end of the area light bar is properly seated around the plastic tab.



Remove the LED Display


1. Push the LED display upward to release its guide tabs from their corresponding slots on the Express 250's frame.



2. When the LED display assembly is released, disconnect the five cables from the back.



NOTE: When reinstalling, connect the five cables to their corresponding connectors on the back of the display. Leave the area light bar cable (e) loose.



- a. Communications cable (USB-A)
- b. Holster light cable
- c. Area light cable x 2 (interchangeable)
- d. Power cable (24 V)



IMPORTANT: Do not allow the LED display to hang from its cables.

Remove the Top Front Panel



- 1. Using two hands, pull the top panel upward to release its guide tabs from their corresponding slots on the Express 250's frame.
- 2. Place a protective cover, such as a lint-free cloth, over the touchscreen to prevent damage during service.



IMPORTANT:If you are replacing a charging cable, be sure to visit Replace a Holsterfor information on replacing the holster BEFORE reinstalling the panels.




IMPORTANT: When reinstalling, push the bottom edge inward to position it inside the groove in the middle vent panel and engage the edge of the sign. Carefully push the panel down until it is firmly seated.



IMPORTANT:When reinstalling, ensure all five cables at the top of the panel are not captured by the front upper panel, and are easily accessible for reinstalling the LED display.


Remove the Auxiliary Power Supply

1. Disconnect the five connectors from the auxiliary power supply:



- a. 480 V power in
- b. Shunt trip relay connector
- c. CAN bus in
- d. Cooling I/O
- e. 12 V power out to internal components
- f. LED display 5 V

2. Use a T25 Torx driver to loosen the four screws at the corners of the auxiliary power supply. Do not fully remove screws: leave the screws in the charging station and move the power supply sideways to release it from the keyhole mounting tabs (g).





NOTE: When reinstalling, torque the four screws hand-tight.


3. Slide the auxiliary power supply toward you to remove it.





Remove the Top Rear Panel


1. Using a T25 Torx (or a Phillips #2 screwdriver for early charging stations), loosen the two hidden captive screws located in the top rear panel's vents, inset from each bottom corner.



2. Using a T25 Torx driver, loosen the two captive screws located at the top of the top rear panel. Using two hands, hold the top rear cover at an angle to remove, leading with the bottom edge.



NOTE: When reinstalling, squeeze the sides of the panel inward to fit the tabs into place in the C-channel, inside the watertight gasket.



Replace the Coolant

1. Using a step ladder if needed, unscrew the reservoir fill cap (a).



NOTE: Do not unscrew the level sensor wiring (b) cap during coolant replacement. Observe the blue tubed connections and make sure there are no leaks before refilling the coolant reservoir.



2. Use a funnel to fill the reservoir to the marked MAX line with coolant.




- 3. Replace the reservoir cap.
- 4. Use the cloth to wipe up any coolant spills.

Clean Coolant Fluid Leak From **5**Power Modules

Bring These Tools and Materials

- Power Module shipping crate (provided by ChargePoint)
- 90% Isopropyl alcohol
- · Paper towel
- Screwdriver (or any tool able to push in the coolant valve)

Open the Power Module Crate

- 1. Open the Power Module shipping crate so the pink plastic bag that contains the Power Modules is visible.
- 2. Without opening the packaging, inspect the Power Modules for leaked glycol and/or signs of damage.
 - · If damaged, contact ChargePoint.
 - If there are no signs of damage but a fluid leak is visible, continue to the next step.

Clean the Coolant Leak

 Open the Power Module packaging and wipe down all external surfaces of the module using 90% isopropyl alcohol and a paper towel.



NOTE: Take extra care when cleaning the bus clip, Power Module pin-out, coolant ports, black plastic cover. Visually inspect these components for any trapped debris.

- 2. After cleaning, check for additional leaks:
 - Insert a dry paper towel under the Power Module's cooling ports.
 - Lift up the module and have it placed so it's oriented on a 45 degree incline (coolant ports closer to the ground).
 - · Gently shake the module vertically.
 - Remove the paper towel and check for signs of further fluid leaks.

3. If there are additional leaks, use a thin tool (such as a screwdriver) to compress the coolant valve to test for pressure. Follow the previous steps to check if the leak persists.



NOTE: You may need to repeat this step up to three tries before the leak subsides.





IMPORTANT: If the leak continues, follow the instructions to return the module to the factory. Do not continue with normal installation.

Test the Power Module

- 3. With only the affected module installed, close up and energize the station.
- 4. If no faults are detected by the station, de-energize the station and proceed with normal installation.

IMPORTANT: Small gauge wiring routed on the sides of the frame could be sheared if they are caught by panel tabs. Ensure wiring is cleared from guide holes when installing bottom and middle rear panels.

5. Determine whether the station has ground straps (a) or EMI shields (b). An Express 250 only needs one of these protection methods. If you're servicing a station with ground straps, skip to "Remove the Fan Tray Assemblies".





Remove the Rear Bottom Panel and EMI Shield

1. Using two hands, carefully pull the panel upward to release the panel's guide tabs from their corresponding slots on the Express 250's frame.



NOTE: When reinstalling, squeeze the sides of the panel inward to fit the tabs into place in the C- channel, inside the watertight gasket. Carefully push the panel down.



Remove the Fan Tray Assemblies

NOTE: Zip ties on the fan tray must be cut off to remove the fan tray assembly.

2. Using two hands, slide the tray upward until the mounting tabs (b) on the fan tray assembly are positioned above their corresponding slots.





NOTE: Check that the power connector at the base of the fan assembly easily disengages as the fan tray is lifted.



- 3. Pull the fan tray assembly toward you to remove it.
- 4. Repeat for the other fan tray.
- 5. When replacing the fan tray:
 - Ensure all four tabs on the fan tray assembly are positioned above their corresponding slots.
 - Press the fan tray assembly against the Express 250, then slide the fan tray downward.
 - Ensure each tab on the fan tray is located under, and not over, its corresponding slot.
 - Ensure the top tabs are engaged into the metal housing behind them.
 - Ensure the fan's power connector at the bottom seats correctly.



NOTE: Fan tray zip ties do not need to be replaced.

Remove the Cooling Controller

1. Identify the cooling controller, located behind the protective foam edging on the middle frame shelf.



2. Remove each cable attached to the front of the cooling controller by pressing in on its tab and pulling out by hand (listed left to right):



NOTE: The CAN cables are interchangeable.



- a. Controller power
- b. Pump
- c. Controller signal
- d. 24 V power
- e. Return
- f. Supply
- g. Level
- h. Fans
- i. CAN 2
- j. CAN1
- 3. Remove the small pressure sensor tube (a) from the front of the heat exchanger by hand. Route the tube down through the grommet in the frame shelf. The tube remains attached to the controller.

4. Use a T20 Torx to remove the two screws attaching the controller to the frame shelf (b). Save the screws for reuse.





NOTE: Ensure the pressure sensor tube is completely seated and centered on the mount point so that air flow is not constricted. Poor installation can result in a false error alert.





Remove the Heat Exchanger Assembly



IMPORTANT: Before removing the heat exchanger, hold a clean, lint-free absorbent cloth below the Quick Connect coolant lines to prevent the liquid from spilling onto the Express 250's other components.

- 1. For each of the two coolant lines (a), push the button on the Quick Connect at the bottom of the heat exchanger assembly and pull to disconnect the coolant line from the heat exchanger assembly.
- 2. Pull the overflow hose (b) out of its corresponding retaining clip.



- 3. Using a T27 Torx driver, remove the five screws from the heat exchanger assembly. Three screws are located along the top edge behind a gasket (a), one is located at the bottom right (b), and one at the bottom left (c).
- 4. Pull the overflow hose (b) out of its corresponding retaining clip.





NOTE: For easy of assembly, the heat exchanger is self-supported with all five screws removed.



NOTE: Ensure the gasket is not torn or damaged during removal and replacement of the heat exchanger.

- 5. Pull the heat exchanger assembly away from the Express 250.
- 6. Drain all coolant from the heat exchanger assembly to prepare for return shipping.



Replace the Heat Exchanger Assembly

- 1. Hang the new assembly onto the two pins on the frame to support it.
- 2. Slightly move the assembly left to right a few millimeters until the top screw holes align. Fasten the five T27 screws, beginning with the three screws across the top edge.
- 3. Fasten the ground wire screw.
- 4. Fill the heat exchanger assembly's reservoir to the marked fill line with coolant.







About Panels



All Express 250 panels have guide tabs that align with corresponding slots on the Express 250's frame. When removing a panel, lift the panel upward to release these tabs from their slots.



NOTE: When installing a panel, align these tabs above their corresponding slots and press the panel downward.

Power off the Station

Power off at the breaker panel and lock out/tag out before continuing work.





2. Loosen both retention knobs (b), allowing the touchscreen beam (c) to slide up vertically and the touchscreen's bottom edge to clear the middle vent panel's slot (d).

3. With hand pressure, tilt the touchscreen upward at a 45-degree angle.



4. Allow the touchscreen to return to its lowest position vertically. Rotate the retention knobs clockwise to re-tighten.



CAUTION: The bottom edge and corners of the touchscreen are sharp. Take care when moving underneath the raised screen.

1. Disconnect the two proximity sensor wires from the connectors on the bottom of the touchscreen and the wire management ring. Move the proximity wires to hang in front of the middle vent panel.



NOTE: When reinstalling, connect the proximity sensor wires to their corresponding connectors: left wire to left port and right wire to right port. Route any excess wiring through the right-side wire management ring under the touchscreen, to prevent it being pinched in the panels.





Open the Power Module Holders (Ground Straps)

1. Use a T25 Torx to remove the front and rear M5 screws and washers attaching the Power Module holder (a) and Power Module (b) ground straps to the Express 250 frame (eight screws total). Keep the screws and washers for use in a later step.



2. Using two hands, squeeze the Power Module mechanism's release bar against the flange. Raise the bar to fully rotate the Power Module mechanism upward to the lock position. This ensures enough clearance for the Power Modules to slide under the mechanism.





3. At the bottom right of the Express 250, press and hold the yellow release latch while pulling the Power Module tray out of the station completely.






Replace the Holster

1. Lay the right extrusion down on a protected surface, with the inside facing up.







Install the CCS1 Holster Shroud



Replace the Wago Label 19

The ChargePoint Wago label is applied to the upper AC Wago terminals, to discourage servicing or tampering of factory-assembled conductors that should not be adjusted in the field. Newer Express 250 stations have this sticker already applied. Previous stations may need it retrofitted during installation or service.

NOTE: When reinstalling, squeeze the sides of the panel inward to fit the tabs into place in the C-channel, inside the watertight gasket. Carefully push the panel down.



Replace the Front Top Panel Sign

- 1. By hand, bow the sign outward to release the adhesive holding it to the cover panel.
- 2. Slide the existing sign upward out of the panel's side grooves.
- 3. Use an isopropyl pad to clean adhesive residue and dust off the cover panel surfaces.
- 4. Remove the liner strips covering the adhesive strips on the new sign.
- 5. Seat the sign first around the U-shaped touchscreen cutout, on the top and both sides.
- 6. Gently bow each of the sign's long edges into the panel's side groove.
- 7. Ensuring the sign is still firmly seated around the top of the U-shaped cutout, gently press down on the sign to attach the adhesive to the cover panel.

Replace the Front Bottom Panel Sign

- 1. Use a T20 Torx driver to remove the two screws from the bottom edge trim. Set the trim aside for reuse.
- 2. By hand, bow the sign outward in the middle to release the adhesive holding it to the cover panel.
- 3. Slide the existing sign upward out of the panel's side grooves.
- 4. Use an isopropyl pad to clean adhesive residue and dust off the cover panel surfaces.
- 5. Remove the liner strips covering the adhesive strips on the new sign.

- 2. By hand, bow the sign outward in the middle to release the adhesive holding it to the cover panel.
- 3. Slide the existing sign upward out of the panel's side grooves.
- 4. Use an isopropyl pad to clean adhesive residue and dust off the cover panel surfaces.
- 5. Remove the liner strips covering the adhesive strips on the new sign.
- 6. Insert one of the sign's side edges into the panel's side groove. Align the bottom edges of the sign and the cover panel.
- 7. Bow the sign slightly to insert the other side edge.
- 8. Gently press down on the sign to attach the adhesive to the cover panel.
- 9. Align the bottom edge trim in place. Use a T20 Torx driver to reinstall the two screws.





Cables are color-coded. Color codes are different for each installed charge connector type.

If the first four digits of the serial number are less than 2133, it is critical that the cables are reattached to their original locations.



NOTE: CHAdeMO has white and black color codes. NACS, CCS1, and CCS2 have red and black color codes. It is easiest to unfasten all cables for better access, even if only one cable is being replaced.





13. After replacing the top cable, skip to Reassemble the Station.

Replace the Bottom Cable

- 1. Swing the bottom arm out for access. Use the provided foam block to hold the arm in place.
- 2. Use a T25 Torx screwdriver to loosen the four M5 captive screws that hold the bottom lid to the station from below.









- 7. Reposition the bottom arm to extend only 45 degrees out from the station. This maximizes the size of the wiring opening. Re-block with the foam block.
- 8. Gently move the bottom cable's wires to identify them in the overall bundle below. Pulling from inside the bottom arm, thread the three bottom cable wires (conductors and communications) up through the body of the station and out. Remove the entire cable from the station.



9. Remove the protective wrapping from the new cable clamp and lift the cable clamp up to the bottom arm. Insert the cable clamp into the slot in the arm so that the screw mounting tabs hold it in place to take the weight of the cable.



- 10. Use a T25 Torx screwdriver and ten M5 screws to secure the cable clamp assembly to the bottom arm. **Torque to 4.5 Nm (40 in-lb).**
- 11. Route the three wires (positive, negative, and communications) through the bottom arm opening where it meets the station. Reach through the top circular opening in the top arm to assist threading the wires through. Once all three connectors are through the circular gasket at the bottom of the bearing stack, continue routing the wires through from below the arms.



12. Position the cable clamp in the arm. For the bottom arm, align the cable clamp so that the first semicircle in the housing (a) matches the gasket line in the arm.



13. Proceed to the next section to reassemble the station.

Reassemble the Station

Refer to the images in the procedures above while replacing the station components:

- 1. Reinstall the ten screws that hold the cable clamp to its arm. Torque to 4.5 Nm (40 in-lb).
- 2. Gently route the data wire through the tensioner, being careful not to overstress or cut the wire.
- 3. If you removed the cover to access the cable clamp screws, replace the ten screws that hold the cover in place. **Torque to 5.3 Nm (47 In-Ib).**
- 4. Check gasket placement to ensure it sits inside the channel all around the arm.
- 5. Replace the lid on top of its arm. From below, use a T25 Torx screwdriver to fasten the four captive screws. **Torque to 2.6 Nm (20 in-lb)**.



NOTE: For the bottom lid, lift up slightly on the lid to help it clear the arm and gasket.





1. Remove the horizontal 50-pin ribbon cable (a). Push the tabs outward. Rock it gently from left to right as you pull out the cable.




2. Remove the remaining two cables connected to the left side of the contactor assembly: 24 V DC power (b), and CAN connectors (c).



NOTE: Each cable is keyed to its corresponding connector except the CAN cables, which are interchangeable.

3. Open the securing latches (d) on the left and right sides of the contactor box assembly by pushing down on the lock tab and lifting the lever.

3. Unplug the connector from position 2 (b) and plug it into position 3 (c).



- 1. Using two hands, pull the top panel upward to release its guide tabs from their corresponding slots on the Express 250's frame.
- 2. Place a protective cover, such as a lint-free cloth, over the touchscreen to prevent damage during service.



IMPORTANT:If you are replacing a charging cable, be sure to visit Replace a Holsterfor information on replacing the holster BEFORE reinstalling the panels.



IMPORTANT:When reinstalling, push the bottom edge inward to position it inside the groove in the middle vent panel and engage the edge of the sign. Carefully push the panel down until it is firmly seated.



IMPORTANT:When reinstalling, ensure all five cables at the top of the panel are not captured by the front upper panel, and are easily accessible for reinstalling the LED display.

Access the Charging Cables

1. Cables are color-coded. Color codes are different for each installed charge connector type.






13. Position the cable clamp in the arm. For the top arm, align the cable clamp so that the second semicircle in the housing (b) matches the gasket line in the arm.



- 14. Use a T25 Torx screwdriver and ten M5 screws to secure the cable clamp assembly to the top arm. **Torque to 4.5 Nm (40 in-lbs).**
- 15. Route the three wires (positive, negative, and communications) through the top arm opening. Reach through the top circular opening in the top arm to assist threading the wires through. Once all three connectors are through the circular gasket at the bottom of the bearing stack, continue routing the wires through from below the arms inside the station.



Remove the Middle Rear Panel

Using two hands, lift the middle rear panel straight up and out to disengage the guide tabs.



NOTE: When reinstalling, squeeze the sides of the panel inward to fit the tabs into place in the C-channel, inside the watertight gasket. For older stations, ensure the lower panel's sign is correctly captured under the middle panel's edge as you carefully push the panel down.





IMPORTANT: Small gauge wiring routed on the sides of the frame could be sheared if caught by panel tabs. Ensure wiring is cleared from guide holes when installing bottom and middle rear panels.

Remove the Bottom Rear Panel

Using two hands, carefully pull the panel upward to release the panel's guide tabs from their corresponding slots on the Express 250's frame.



NOTE: When reinstalling, squeeze the sides of the panel inward to fit the tabs into place in the C-channel, inside the watertight gasket. Carefully push the panel down.





IMPORTANT: For installation or servicing, Surface Conduit Entry (SCE) extrusions can be removed without removing the SCE or rear bottom panel. However, if the rear bottom panel must be removed, first remove the SCE cover and loosen the box base side screws. For more details, refer to the Express 250 Surface Conduit Entry guide on ChargePoint University: chargepoint.com/installers.



Open the Power Module Holders (Ground Straps)



NOTE: If the station has EMI shields instead of ground straps, refer to Open the Power Module Holders (EMI Shields) instead.

1. Use a T25 Torx to remove the front and rear M5 screws and washers attaching the Power Module holder (a) and Power Module (b) ground straps to the Express 250 frame (eight screws total). Keep the screws and washers for use in a later step.



2. Using two hands, squeeze the Power Module mechanism's release bar against the flange. Raise the bar to fully rotate the Power Module mechanism upward to the lock position. This ensures enough clearance for the Power Modules to slide under the mechanism.

- 3. Use a T25 Torx to remove the rubberized washer and M5 shoulder screw. Set them aside for reuse.



4. Using a step ladder, hold the extrusion with one hand and loosen the top two captive screws using the supplied T25 Torx driver.








NOTE: Images show screw locations from the outside. Fasteners are accessed inside the frame.




NOTE: The top and middle screws are asymmetrical.

5. Use a T25 Torx driver to loosen the middle two captive screws while the Power Module mechanism is still in the closed position.



6. Use a T25 Torx driver to loosen the bottom two captive screws.



7. Slightly tilt the bottom of the extrusion out to extract its top edge from under the bottom edge of the area light bar. Lift the extrusion off the guide pins on each side of the frame that hold the extrusion in place.



- 8. Disconnect the shortest cable from the top holster.
- 9. Disconnect the next-longest cable from the bottom holster.





IMPORTANT: When reinstalling, check that these connections are correctly seated, or the system will not operate.

- 10. Locate the P-clip mounted to one of the holsters (top or bottom holster varies by product version).
- 11. Remove the P-clip hardware from the extrusion holster:
 - Generation 1, attached with screw: use a T25 Torx driver to remove the screw and all its components. Carefully note the order of the components.
 - Generation 2, attached with nut (a): Use an 8 mm (5/16 in) nut driver to remove only the nut and the P-clip.
- 12. Remove the shielded holster cable from the opening in the P-clip (b).
- 13. Remove the existing extrusion from the station.




Remove the Contactor Assembly



IMPORTANT:Before work, take a picture of which cable tab plugs into which slot on the contactor assembly. Cables are color-coded (black is positive, red is negative). Color codes are different for each installed charge connector type. It is critical that the cables are reattached to their original locations.

1. Using a T20 Torx driver, remove the screws (a) that attach the cable tabs to the front of the contactor assembly.



2. Remove the cable tabs by moving them slightly back and forth while pulling straight out to release.



NOTE: Avoid touching the tab contact area. Handle the cable tabs by their edges.


IMPORTANT: There are up to three possible charge connector slots shown as 1, 2, and 3 on the front plastic cover (b). Note the position of each communication connector before removal. Each cable must be reattached to its original connector slot on the contactor assembly. Failure to do so may damage the station or vehicle.



If the original connector location is unknown, the cable can be attached to the contactor assembly based on the connector type indicated by the label:

3. Remove all cables connected to the left side of the contactor assembly:




- a. Charge cable communications (a)
- b. DCC communication ribbon cable (b)
- c. 24 V DC power (c)
- d. CAN connectors (d)



NOTE: To remove the horizontal ribbon cable, push the tabs outward. Rock it gently from left to right as you pull out the cable. Each cable is keyed to its corresponding connector except the CAN cables, which are interchangeable.

- 4. Open the securing latches on the left and right sides of the contactor box assembly by pushing down on the lock tab and lifting the lever (e).
- 5. Disengage the contactor assembly from the large bus bar connections at the bottom (f) by holding it with two hands near the bottom and rocking the assembly slightly as you pull outward.

6. Once the bus bar connections release, pull the assembly forward along the support arms (g), then lift free from the station.




Remove the Auxiliary Power Supply

1. Disconnect the five connectors from the auxiliary power supply:



- a. 480 V power in
- b. Shunt trip relay connector
- c. CAN bus in
- d. Cooling I/O
- e. 12 V power out to internal components
- f. LED display 5 V

2. Use a T25 Torx driver to loosen the four screws at the corners of the auxiliary power supply. Do not fully remove screws: leave the screws in the charging station and move the power supply sideways to release it from the keyhole mounting tabs (g).





NOTE: When reinstalling, torque the four screws hand-tight.


3. Slide the auxiliary power supply toward you to remove it.

Remove the Swing Arm Assembly


1. Use an 10 mm (3/8 in) hex wrench to remove the two swing arm ground wires from the frame in the upper right corner.




2. Swing the top swing arm open and use cardboard or other non-scratching material to shim it in place. Use a T25 Torx to loosen the four M5 captive screws that hold the top lid to the station from below. Set the top lid aside on a padded surface.



3. Using a step ladder, use a T25 Torx to remove the second and fourth screws from the left, along both the front and back edges (four screws total).



4. Loop the lifting strap through the top ring of the lifting plate so that all loops can be picked up by a forklift fork.



5. Use a T25 to attach the lifting plate to the left side of the swing arm assembly. Hand tighten all four screws.



6. As a safety measure, position the forklift to secure the lifting plate straps. Ensure the straps are secured at least 300 mm (12 in) from the end of the fork.




- 7. Secure a C-clamp on the outside of the strap to secure it to the fork.
- 8. Use foam, a shop cloth, or other non-damaging object to block the hole in the right side of the frame and prevent screws from dropping into the station (white foam shown).



9. Remove the toroid ferrite from each pair of charge cables.



NOTE: When reinstalling, the narrow part of the sleeve faces downward.



10. Use a T25 Security Torx to remove one external screw next to the right extrusion, under the edge of the LED diffuser.




11. Use a T25 Security Torx to remove six screws from the circular housing under the swing arm (a, three of the six screws shown). Bundle the cables and move them to the left to access the back screws. Save the screws for later re-use.



NOTE: Do not remove the two screws that hold the gasket to the frame (b). The gasket screws look different because they are not recessed into the gasket.



CAUTION: Do not drop any screws into the station. Fasteners can drop into the bus bars and cause electrical malfunction or damage.



12. Position one person to the side, holding the bundle of cables. Slowly lift the forklift forks a minimum of 254 m (10 in) above the frame.



13. Have the person on the ground carefully feed the conductor, communication cables, and ground wires up through the station's circular bushing opening while the forklift continues to lift the swing arm assembly free of the station.




- 14. Set the old swing arm assembly and its cables aside for later re-packaging in the FRU kit crate.
- 15. Transfer the lifting plate from the old swing arm assembly to the new one. Hand tighten all four screws.

Replace the Swing Arm Assembly

- 1. Use the forklift to position the new swing arm assembly a minimum of 254 mm (10 in) above the station.
- 2. While the assembly is suspended, carefully feed the conductors, communication cables, and ground wires down through the top of the station into the circular bushing opening.
- 3. Position a piece of thin cardboard as a shim on the left side of the frame's top skid pad to help level the swing arms.



4. Align the right side of the swing arm so that the circular housing fits inside the bushing.





5. Use the forklift to slowly lower the swing arm assembly into place. Do not remove the forklift yet.



6. Use a T25 Security Torx to replace the one external screw next to the right extrusion. Torque to 4.5 Nm (40 in-lb).



CAUTION: Do not drop any screws into the station. Fasteners can drop into the station bus bars and cause electrical malfunction or damage. Account for all fasteners before completing the procedure.

- 7. Use a T25 Security Torx to replace the six screws into the circular housing under the swing arm: the three bushing screws on the left (interior side) of the cables first, then the three screws on the right (exterior side) of the cables. Torque to 4.5 Nm (40 in-lb).
- 8. Remove the C-clamp and the forklift.
- 9. Use an 10 mm (3/8 in) hex wrench to reattach the swing arm ground wires to the frame in the upper right corner, both on same stud. Torque to 2.9 Nm (25 in-lb).
- 10. Remove the lifting plate. Attach it to the old swing arm that is being returned to ChargePoint.
- 11. Replace the top swing arm plate per previous instructions. Torque to 2.9 Nm (25 in-lb).
- 12. Replace the ferrites on each pair of charge cable conductors.

Replace the Contactor Assembly

- 1. Ensure latch clasps are open and not blocking the contactor assembly before installation.
- 2. Rest the alignment pegs of the contactor assembly on the support arm hooks.

3. Slide the contactor assembly back along the support arms. Push the assembly to engage the bus bars until fully seated.




IMPORTANT: Ensure the connectors are aligned before pressing in. Do not apply excessive force. Doing so can damage the connectors. Once seated, gently pull the contactor assembly outward as a push-pull test to confirm it is securely seated.



NOTE: Ensure all cables are accessible without being pinched or caught under the contactor assembly.

- 4. Fasten the latches on the right and left sides of the contactor assembly.
- 5. Reconnect each cable on the left side of the contactor assembly.
- 6. Wipe down the contact surface of each cable tab with isopropyl alcohol wipes.
- 7. After double-checking the photo of the cable order, push each cable tab into its corresponding slot. Ensure the plastic guide post is fully seated to be level with the surface of the cable tab.
- 8. Use a T20 Torx driver to re-fasten the screw on each cable tab. Torque to 2.8 Nm (25 in-lb).

9. Tuck the excess contactor cable down the side of the enclosure to avoid interfering with the cover panel in a later step.



- a. Charge cable communications
- b. DCC communication ribbon



NOTE: Ensure the key aligns with the notch in the socket.

- c. 24V DC power
- d. CAN connectors (interchangeable)



NOTE: Secure connector body to the mating connector on the contactor assembly and ensure the tabs are in the open position. During connection the insertion tabs will automatically close onto the connector housing.

Replace the Auxiliary Power Supply

- 1. Slide the auxiliary power supply into the station above the contactor assembly.
- 2. Ensure the keyhole mounting tabs at the corners of the auxiliary power supply are aligned with the loose screws on the station. Torque the screws hand-tight.

- 3. Connect the five connectors from the auxiliary power supply:
 - a. 480 V power in
 - b. Shunt trip relay connector
 - c. CAN bus in
 - d. Cooling I/O
 - e. 12 V power out to internal components
 - f. LED display 5 V

Replace the Right Extrusion

- Slightly tilt the right extrusion and slide its top edge under the bottom edge of the area light bar. Align
 the holes in the extrusion with the guide pins on each side of the Express 250's frame. This
 temporarily holds the extrusion in place.
- 2. Install the shielded holster cable and P-clip hardware to the extrusion holsters using either a T25 Torx Driver (Generation 1) or an 8 mm (5/16 in) nut driver (Generation 2).
- 3. Connect the longest cable to the bottom holster and the shortest cable to the top holster.



NOTE: Ensure the connections are correctly seated, or the system will not operate.

4. Using a step ladder, hold the extrusion with one hand and loosely secure the top two captive screws using the supplied T25 Torx driver.



NOTE: The top and middle screws are asymmetrical.


- 5. Use a T25 Torx driver to loosely secure the bottom two screws next. The Power Module holders must not be inside the charging station to have access to the bottom screws.
- 6. Use a T25 Torx driver to loosely secure the middle two screws, just above the Power Module mechanism. Access to the middle screws is easier with the Power Module mechanism handle in the closed (down) position.
- 7. Tighten all right extrusion screws.
- 8. At the bottom right of the Express 250, press and hold the yellow release latch while pushing the Power Module tray into the station until it locks into place.



9. Using two hands, squeeze the Power Module mechanism's release bar and lower it halfway to check alignment with the ports and guide posts.



10. Lower the Power Module mechanism until you hear a click as the mechanism locks into place. Ensure the mechanism is fully engaged with all Power Module connectors. The Power Module mechanism should fully cover the ridges on the Power Module's top edge.






If the mechanism does not engage, raise it again and push the Power Modules to the back of the station to realign, then try again. Do not apply excessive force.

REVERSE THE ABOVE STEPS TO REPLACE THE EMI SHIELD (IF APPLICABLE), REAR PANELS, FRONT PANELS, LED DISPLAY, AND AREA LIGHT BAR.



About Panels



All Express 250 panels have guide tabs that align with corresponding slots on the Express 250's frame. When removing a panel, lift the panel upward to release these tabs from their slots.



NOTE: When installing a panel, align these tabs above their corresponding slots and press the panel downward.

Power off the Station

Power off at the breaker panel and lock out/tag out before continuing work.



DANGER: RISK OF SHOCK. Before performing this procedure, disconnect the power to the Express 250 at the service panel. Remove the Area Light Bar

1. Using a T25 Security screwdriver, loosen the two captive screws on the area light bar.



2. Disconnect the power cable that connects the area light bar to the LED display assembly. Remove the area light bar.



NOTE: When reinstalling, ensure the gasket on each end of the area light bar is properly seated around the plastic tab.



Remove the LED Display


1. Push the LED display upward to release its guide tabs from their corresponding slots on the Express 250's frame.



2. When the LED display assembly is released, disconnect the five cables from the back.



NOTE: When reinstalling, connect the five cables to their corresponding connectors on the back of the display. Leave the area light bar cable (e) loose.



- a. Communications cable (USB-A)
- b. Holster light cable
- c. Area light cable x 2 (interchangeable)
- d. Power cable (24 V)



IMPORTANT: Do not allow the LED display to hang from its cables.

Remove the Top Front Panel



- 1. Using two hands, pull the top panel upward to release its guide tabs from their corresponding slots on the Express 250's frame.
- 2. Place a protective cover, such as a lint-free cloth, over the touchscreen to prevent damage during service.



IMPORTANT:If you are replacing a charging cable, be sure to visit Replace a Holsterfor information on replacing the holster BEFORE reinstalling the panels.




IMPORTANT: When reinstalling, push the bottom edge inward to position it inside the groove in the middle vent panel and engage the edge of the sign. Carefully push the panel down until it is firmly seated.



IMPORTANT: When reinstalling, ensure all five cables at the top of the panel are not captured by the front upper panel, and are easily accessible for reinstalling the LED display.

Remove the Touchscreen

1. Use a T25 Torx driver to remove the M5 screw and washer (a) attaching each touchscreen ground strap to the frame. Keep the screws and washers for reuse.



2. Loosen both retention knobs (b), allowing the touchscreen beam (c) to slide up vertically and the touchscreen's bottom edge to clear the middle vent panel's slot (d).

3. With hand pressure, tilt the touchscreen upward at a 45-degree angle.



4. Allow the touchscreen to return to its lowest position vertically. Rotate the retention knobs clockwise to re-tighten.



CAUTION: The bottom edge and corners of the touchscreen are sharp. Take care when moving underneath the raised screen.

- 5. Disconnect all cables from the connectors on the bottom of the touchscreen and remove them from the wire management rings.
- 6. While supporting the touchscreen, continuously rotate the touchscreen's knobs ounter-clockwise until they are completely removed. Remove the touchscreen from the station.



Replace the Touchscreen

1. Align the hooks of the new touchscreen's mounting bracket over the retention knob supports. Tighten the knobs enough to secure the touchscreen.

- 2. Connect all cables to the underside of the touchscreen:
 - a. Proximity sensor cables x 2 (connect left wire to left port, right wire to right port)
 - b. Speaker cable
 - c. Europe only: meter cable (if applicable)
 - d. 24 V DC cable
 - e. CAT CPNK to DCC (Station Management Unit)
 - f. LED Display cable (USB-A)




IMPORTANT: Perform a pull-push test to ensure that each cable is correctly seated. Failure to connect these correctly could prevent the system from powering on.

- 3. Connect the proximity sensor wires on the middle vent panel to the corresponding connectors on the bottom of the touchscreen: left wire to left port and right wire to right port.
- 4. Route any excess wiring through the right-side wire management ring under the touchscreen, to prevent it being pinched in the panels.
- 5. Route all other cables through the wire management rings on the underside of the touchscreen.



IMPORTANT: Ensure all wires are neatly organized and pressed toward the back of the Express 250 to allow the touchscreen to be easily lowered into the slot on the middle vent panel. Ensure the wires are not pinched between the touchscreen and the vent panel.

6. With hand pressure, swing the touchscreen down. Loosen both retention knobs (b), allowing the touchscreen beam (c) to slide up vertically. Re-tighten the knobs at the highest position. Tilt the bottom of the touchscreen inside the slot in the middle vent panel, aligning the notch in the center of the bottom edge (d) to the guide ridge inside the panel slot.




- 7. Keeping pressure on the edge of the touchscreen to properly seat it inside the panel, loosen the knobs to lower the screen again.
- 8. With both hands, hold the beam (c) and rotate the top of the bar away from you to relieve stress at the retention knobs. Re- tighten the knobs to secure it.
- 9. Use a T25 Torx driver to replace the M5 screw and washer (a) attaching each touchscreen ground strap to the frame. Torque to 4 Nm (35 in-lb).
